

# The Reut Institute Update on Action and Impact January 2010

#### Introduction

Along with the full Reut Institute staff, the National Security team harnessed its efforts to support the <u>Israel 2021 conference</u> organized by Israel's leading financial newspaper, TheMarker, in cooperation with Reut. The conference dealt with the main issues facing the national agenda over the next decade, with the ultimate goal achieving social and economic leapfrogging.

In addition, Reut's bi-annual Organizational Seminar this month engaged all teams at Reut in a series of executive-led and peer-led forums designed to grapple with the most pressing issues facing the Reut Institute's organizational development.

The National Security team's efforts primarily focused on community engagement through Eran Shayshon's trip to Orange County, CA. In this one week visit, Eran addressed community leaders, activists and other community members. In addition to maintaining ongoing efforts with the Israeli government, additional areas of focus advanced projects in the San Francisco Bay Area and Reut efforts to convene a conference bringing together an activist network to combat the assault on Israel's legitimacy.

The team also met with elements from Israel's security and intelligence establishment for an update and debrief, and advanced efforts to assist Israel's foreign affairs establishment in their engagement with civil society.
